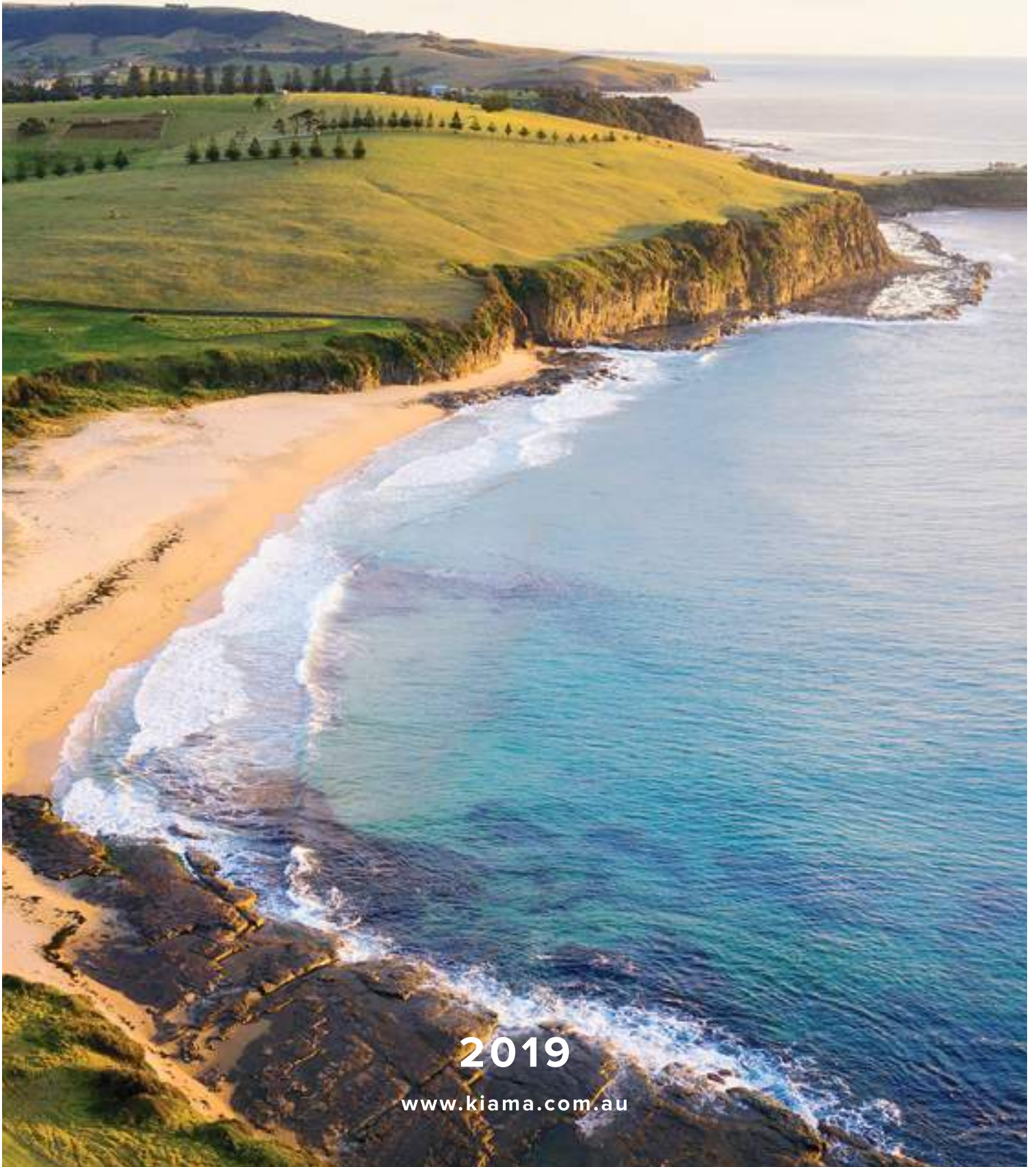

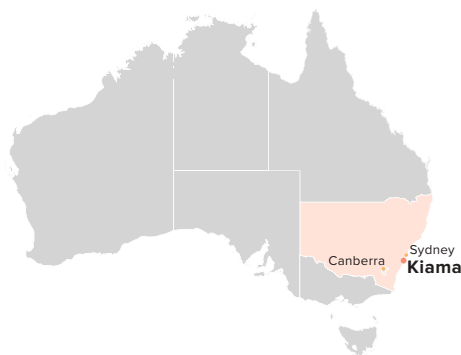

GETTING HERE

DRIVE: The Princes Hwy (M1) runs south from Sydney, or follow the scenic Grand Pacific Drive. Hume Hwy/Illawarra Hwy is quickest from Canberra.

Approx driving times to Kiama: Sydney 1hr45min; Canberra 3hr; Blue Mountains 2hrs; Southern Highlands 45min; Jervis Bay 1hr; Wollongong 30min; Batemans Bay 2hrs.

TRAIN: Trains from Sydney to Kiama depart approx every hour, taking around 2hrs. See www.cityrail.com.au (South Coast Line) for more information or phone 13 15 00.

FLY: Sydney is the closest major airport. It is approx 1.5hr drive to Kiama or approx 2.5hr on the train (via Wollli Creek). Fly Corporate also offers services to Illawarra Regional Airport (20min north of Kiama) from Melbourne and Brisbane.

📶 WI-FI

Kiama was one of the first locations in Australia to receive highspeed NBN internet. Kiama's central business area offers free WiFi for all – simply connect to "Kiama Council Free WiFi". Many cafes/accommodation also offer WiFi services – just ask.



A WHALE OF A TIME

WHEN: Late May to July, Humpback and Southern Right whales can be seen migrating north. From September to November, they head back south again with their calves.

WHERE: Best on-land viewing spots are Blowhole Point Kiama, Gerringong headland (Belinda St) or the platform on Minnamurra headland.

KIAMA

The classic coastal escape





It could be the rhythmic hum of the breaking waves; the reassuring wink from the iconic lighthouse or the “whoosh” from NSW’s most famous blowhole. But whatever it is, Kiama’s relaxing coastal vibe has an instant effect.

This is a town that knows how to make a visitor feel welcome – after all, it was on the relaxation radar long before radar was even a thing. Ever since those first passenger trains rolled into town in the 1880s, Kiama has been proudly showing off its abundance of natural riches – with crowds returning year after year for a chance to recharge and revel in everything the region has to offer.

This coastal escape was originally the only stop on your journey – but today acts as the region’s centre and the perfect base to explore in all directions. That said, there is plenty to keep you busy right here – including picnics in the park (with free WiFi),

stunning local beaches and ocean pools, a cheeky brunch in one of the many quality cafes or some much-needed retail therapy. Kiama offers something for everyone!

Blowhole Point is the ideal place to get your bearings – and also the best place to enjoy 360 degree views. Located at the eastern end of town (if you end up in the ocean, you’ve gone too far), it’s here that you’ll find the world-famous Blowhole, Kiama Lighthouse and the Visitor Centre. And while the Blowhole is best in a south easterly swell, the Kiama Visitor Information Centre is perfect every day!

Kiama has the perfect mix of experiences and venues to suit every kind of getaway – a vibrant and beautiful backdrop for everything from social gatherings and family adventures to chilled hideaway or romantic rendezvous...

YOUR POCKET ITINERARY

- No visit is complete without checking out the world famous **Kiama Blowhole**.
- If nature’s not bringing the “whoosh”, try the **Little Blowhole** on Tingira Crescent.
- Visit Collins Street’s historic **Terrace Houses**.
- If it’s the right time of year, **grab a towel** and hit up the two **harbourside ocean pools** or **Surf, Kendalls** or **East Beach**.
- An **early morning walk** along the paths from Black Beach, past the lighthouse and on to Kendalls Beach.
- Drive up **Saddleback Mountain** and soak up the views.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Kiama’s **world-famous blowholes** were formed from volcanic lava flows about 260 million years ago (that’s 100 million years before the dinosaurs).
- Kiama-born **Orry George Kelly** won three Academy Awards for Costume Design – working on classics such as *Casablanca* and *Some Like it Hot*.
- While sitting on a Kiama beach in 1977, Professor Graeme Clark got the inspiration for the **world’s first cochlear implant** for the ear.
- A **tramway** used to run down the middle of Kiama’s main street, delivering blue metal from the quarries to waiting ships.

GERRINGONG & GERROA

Watch your worries drift away



A barefoot youth slowly rides a bicycle, surfboard under one arm. Nearby, a family enjoys an early evening feed of fish 'n' chips within earshot of crashing breakers. These are the sights and sounds of the twin towns of Gerringong and Gerroa – the southern welcome mat to the Kiama area.

It's here, along this breathtaking mix of rugged and sandy coastline, that things just seem a notch more laid back. It's as if every timeless coastal memory has been packed together into one relaxed, natural location.

Gerringong's vibrant hilltop village is loaded with unique delights and browse-friendly stores, overlooking the arc of Werri Beach as it stretches between the two headlands. It's here that you'll find a contemporary collection of surf and seaside fashion, cafes, homewares, galleries, workshops and retreats.

Amid the bustling new growth however, there remains a strong holiday vibe – with a sunrise surf or quiet dip in the town's two rock pools still one of the best ways to welcome a new day.

A few gentle hills and a golf course away, Gerroa hugs its own headland as it faces the long horizon-tickling curve of Seven Mile Beach to the south. No matter what time of year, water fun is always on the menu here – from the toddler-friendly shallows of the Crooked River mouth to surf lessons, snorkelling, swimming, windsurfing and more.

And just when you think you've seen it all from these seaside siblings, along comes monthly cinema events, regular markets, top walks, a hedge maze, stunning wineries and a microbrewery with friendly welcome. In fact, the only thing not welcome here are your worries...

YOUR POCKET ITINERARY

- Get your bearings and snap incredible views at **Mt Pleasant lookout** just south of Kiama or **Kingsford Smith lookout** in Gerroa.
- Explore the history and seclusion of Gerringong's **hilltop cemetery and ocean pool** at Boat Harbour.
- Hit the open seaside links of **Gerringong Golf Course** – one of the South Coast's most scenic.
- Hang ten with **surfing lessons** on the beginner-friendly waves of Seven Mile Beach.
- **While away an afternoon** among the vines at a boutique winery or see what's on tap at the local brewery.

DID YOU KNOW?

- In 1933, Sir Charles Kingsford-Smith used Seven Mile Beach at Gerroa as the runway for the **first commercial flight** between Australia and New Zealand.
- Ex-Australian rugby league representative, **Mick Cronin**, owns and operates Gerringong Hotel.
- At low tide, **fossils** can be found in the basalt rock platforms around Gerroa's Black Head.
- Held each year in January, the 1.8km **Captain Christie Ocean Swim** dates back to 1882 – when its namesake accepted a challenge to swim around Gerringong's rocky headland to win a bottle of whisky!



JAMBEROO

An adventurous mix
of rolling hills and thrills



Just a short drive from the ocean, Kiama's coastal vibe gives way to a series of open fertile valleys and lush foothills. Here in dairy country, it's easy to be lulled into blissful relaxation by the undulating landscape, quiet rural lanes and silent rainforests. But don't let those sleepy Illawarra Shorthorn cows fool you... this is also a great place to get your adventure fix!

From the rainforest-clad escarpment, you'll take in stunning panoramic views north across the region at a treetop walk like no other. The Illawarra Fly's collection of walkways, cantilevers and towers see native bush peel back to reveal breathtaking camera-friendly vistas. Or if it's real flying you're after, the famous eco-zipline tour will have you soaring through the trees – safely rocketing you through this spectacular forest setting.

A little closer to sea level, Minnamurra Rainforest is a lush reminder of what this entire region looked like some 200 years ago and features an accessible-friendly loop track. Meanwhile, just up the road, you might be surprised to find NSW's favourite water theme park. From September to April, Jamberoo Action Park dishes up a friendly mix of world-class thrill rides & slides, lazy rivers, wave pools, mini golf, refreshments and much more.

At the centre of all this of course is the undeniably picturesque village of Jamberoo – its pub a gathering place, waterhole and museum for visitors and locals alike. This is a town where music festivals ring out through the valley, where classic vehicle enthusiasts ride alongside lycra-clad cyclists, and where the traffic always gives way to the cattle...

YOUR POCKET ITINERARY

- Control the action at NSW's favourite water theme park **Jamberoo Action Park** – filled with wild rides and family-friendly summer fun, all juxtaposed amid idyllic green hills!
- Enjoy the views and get your heart racing at the **Illawarra Fly Tree Top Walk** and eco-zipline adventure.
- Take in spectacular vista from the **Illawarra Lookout**, Knights Hill (Jamberoo Mountain Road).
- Hike to the waterfall at **Minnamurra Rainforest**.
- Play 18 holes at the beautiful **Jamberoo Golf Course** or try footgolf in the afternoons.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Nearly 400 **dry stone walls** can still be seen throughout the area – built as fencing by Thomas Newing between 1860 and 1930.
- Late footballer **Johnny Warren** captained the Socceroos 24 times, and his legacy lives on in a special museum room at his family's Jamberoo Pub.
- Jamberoo Action Park started life as a **grass skiing** facility – hosting the World Grass Ski Titles in 1983.
- Illawarra Fly Zipline Tour is officially the **highest eco-zipline** in Australia, up to 35m above the forest floor.



MINNAMURRA & BOMBO

Where Mother Nature meets
Father Time...



The Minnamurra River marks Kiama’s northern border – a safe swimming spot and home to kayakers, paddle boarders and more, all enjoying its sandy shores and tidal personality. It also marks the beginning of the popular 22km Kiama Coast Walk and doesn’t disappoint in its first leg of the relay.

The best views can be found a short climb away on the nearby grassy headland – a full panoramic sweep of the Minnamurra township and Kiama’s namesake golf course nestled into the bow curve of the river. Meanwhile, the secluded Mystics Beach and offshore Stack Island offer a taste for the spectacular geological journey to come.

This first section of the walk (that will eventually end in Gerringong) includes some of the most dramatic and varied coastline – including great whale watching opportunities

from the platform north of popular surf spot Jones’ Beach, as well as the world-famous photogenic Cathedral Rocks upright formations. (Have your camera ready!)

A short detour to the beautiful sheltered cove known as The Boneyard is a must-do (just don’t tell the locals we sent you), while the dramatic Bombo headland is truly “out of this world”. These monolithic basalt columns and weathered rock formations are popular with location scouts and instagrammers alike – living examples of geology, mining and erosion in action.

This slice of Kiama is truly nature’s playground. And this is on full display once the wild beauty of Bombo Beach and Kiama’s lighthouse come into view, as many surfers enjoy one of the region’s most popular breaks.

YOUR POCKET ITINERARY




- Make the most of **Minnamurra River** – swimming, stand-up paddleboarding or kayaking.
- **Catch a wave** at Minnamurra (Mystics) Beach, Jones Beach or North Bombo.
- Grab a picnic and snorkel the unique rocky reef at the **Boneyard** – accessed by parking at end of Cliff Drive.
- Get your camera ready for some stunning panoramic views at **Bombo Headland** – not to mention out of this world rock columns leftover from blue metal quarry days.
- Explore the highly photogenic **Cathedral Rocks**, at the southern end of Jones Beach.





DID YOU KNOW?





- Minnamurra means “plenty of fish” in the local aboriginal dialect. Evidence of **shell middens and stone tools** can be seen at the mouth of the Minnamurra River – once a common gathering place for the Dharawal people.
- Bombo quarry’s **“moonscape”** has made it a popular spot for shooting TV commercials and music videos.
- **Stack Island** off the Minnamurra headland is also known by locals as Rangoon Island – after the coal ship *Rangoon* was wrecked upon its rocks in 1850.
- Bombo railway station (opened in 1888) has the reputation as the **closest station to the coast** in Australia.

HISTORY & HERITAGE

Discover the early days of this resource-rich region

-  **260 million years ago** – Kiama Blowholes are formed
-  **20,000+ years ago** – Dharawal people live here and sustainably manage the land
-  **Pre-1800** – Red Cedar-rich rainforests cover entire Illawarra region

-  **1837** – Kiama's first pub, "The Gum Tree Inn" opens
-  **1860s** – After failing crops, Jamberoo begins dairy farming
-  **1870s** – Basalt quarrying begins in a dozen locations
-  **1876** – Kiama harbour completed

-  **1797** – George Bass sights Kiama Blowhole
-  **1812** – Red Cedar logging and rainforest clearing begins
-  **1821** – First permanent European settlers arrive
-  **1832** – First permanent house built in Kiama

Well beyond the limits of holiday nostalgia, Kiama is rich in history – with clues to its past just waiting to be explored.

Traditional stories speak of the Dharawal people who first came to the Illawarra, bringing with them the cabbage tree palm (still seen throughout the Kiama area). Nomadic Wadi Wadi tribes then passed through this heavily bush-clad region, following trails north to Bass Point (Shellharbour) or La Perouse (Botany Bay). One of their traditional camps was near modern-day Jamberoo (which actually means 'track').

The areas of Gerringong and Bombo were considered good sources of "ochre" – a deep orange clay used for aboriginal ceremonies. And this would not be the last time that Kiama's mineral riches were sought out.


When George Bass sailed alongside Kiama Blowhole in December 1797, he became the first European to witness what Indigenous Australians called "where the sea makes a noise". This ushered in a wave of development which would see

towering cedar forests all but removed and basalt quarries carved across the region to supply a growing nation.

Kiama's swift growth peaked in the late 1800s – as seen in many of the dates on heritage buildings around town. And today, these landmarks of Kiama's relatively recent history sit squarely upon the silent reminders of more ancient beginnings.

ASK A LOCAL

The friendly team at the Kiama Visitor Information Centre have all the answers!

Q: How should I pronounce “Kiama”?

A: Think of how you would say “I AM A” and it rhymes with that. So “I AM A visitor to KIAMA”. Easy!

Q: What hours does the blowhole operate?

A: Mondays/Tuesdays 8am-10am and 1pm until..., no just kidding! It’s a natural attraction, and is open 24/7 every day of the year.

Q: What if the Blowhole isn’t “blowing”?

A: Nature is a fickle mistress, and sadly we have not figured out how to coin-operate it yet. Just know that it’s all about wind direction. Kiama Blowhole (near lighthouse) is at its “whoosh-iest” in a SE wind, while the Little Blowhole (see Points of Interest section on page 29) likes to show off in a NE wind.

Q: Any good walks/hikes in the area?

A: Oh, you’re in for a treat! The Kiama Coast Walk extends 22km from Minnamurra to Gerringong. It even has its own spread (pg 24-25) in this guide. You’ll also find some other great walks on pages 26–27.



Q: Is Minnamurra Rainforest in Minnamurra?

A: It’s actually west of Jamberoo (easily signposted from there) at the start of the Minnamurra River, and not in the village of Minnamurra, which is where the river meets the sea.

Q: Does Kiama have a railway station?

A: It does – located on the very originally named Railway Pde, 2 minutes from the main street and 10 minutes from the lighthouse/blowhole. Kiama is the last electric stop from Sydney, but diesel trains continue south to Bomaderry (Nowra) via Gerringong and Berry.

Q: How’s the WiFi here?

A: Kiama was one of the first towns in Australia to be connected to the NBN high speed broadband network, and visitors can tap into free internet throughout the downtown Kiama area (select Kiama Council Free Wifi). Many cafes and accommodation also offer WiFi – just ask!

Q: Where can I see kangaroos?

A: If you’re extremely patient, one may bounce down the main street in the middle of the night. But otherwise, you’ll want to head further south along the coast (or to a wildlife park or zoo).

Q: Why are they called the Cathedral Rocks?

A: Because the rocks are all shaped like Prince Harry. Okay, no – it is of course because they resemble the spires of a cathedral (albeit a soggy one).

Q: Is Kiama a good place for fishing?

A: We give fishing enthusiasts the same advice that we give broken-hearted visitors – “there are plenty of fish in the sea!”. Check out page 49 for some fishing spots and advice. (Personally, we consider Kiama quite the catch...)

Q: Can I free camp in the Kiama area?

A: Very good question. While there are no free camping facilities in Kiama town itself (great holiday parks though!), in Jamberoo campervans can park alongside the creek near Kevin Walsh Oval. It’s a nice spot – bring your skateboard.

Q: You mentioned great holiday parks?

A: Yes, you’ll find these at Surf, Kendalls and Easts Beach, as well as Werri Beach in Gerringong and alongside Crooked River at Gerroa. Top notch – family friendly, couples friendly, human friendly.

Q: And other accommodation options?

A: Take your pick – from motels, hotels and resorts through to BnBs, holiday homes to hire or even the corner of someone’s garage on Airbnb.

Q: Which is furthest north? Adelaide or Kiama?

A: Hmm... it’s close, but Kiama is slightly more north. Fun fact: we’re also exactly the same latitude as Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Q: Should I tell my friends how great the Kiama area is?

A: Hmmm, another tricky one. We understand your dilemma, but we say YES – there is plenty of Kiama to go around and if they’re really your friend, they also deserve a great holiday. Just don’t forget to tag your pictures #kiama to share the love with us too!

SURF BEACH

Surf Beach (or Main Beach) is popular for both swimming and surfing – with surfers calling the break ‘The Wedge’.

In a country not short on sandy golden fringes, the Kiama area's many beaches still manage to extract “wow” moments from even the saltiest of ocean loving guests.

Maybe it's the way the beaches blend in so well with the towns they define. Perhaps it's their finite shape, golden complexion or wide variety of personalities and aspects. Whatever it is, Kiama always makes a splash for beach lovers and surfers alike.

While a lot has changed since those first steam trains brought holidaymakers to the coast back in the 1890s, our beaches remain as timeless and alluring as ever. From north to south,

these spots are sprinkled generously along our unspoilt coastline (see map pgs 32-33) – offering visitors refreshing swims, castle-friendly sand or a world-class wave.

In recent years, Kiama has become a beacon for a variety of high profile events – putting the area on the map and on the international boardriding calendar.

It's little wonder the area has been responsible for breeding a generation of professional surf athletes including Ali Day and Sally Fitzgibbons. Not that you'd know it of course – with the same laid back vibe and friendly wave for anyone who comes to visit.



MYSTICS BEACH

One of only a handful of National Surfing Reserves in Australia. Amazing surfing when the conditions align.



JONES BEACH

Situated between Minnamurra Headland and Cathedral Rocks, a popular Kiama Downs surf spot.



BONEYARD

Features a pristine bay perfect for swimming, and a right-hand reefbreak for surfing.



NORTH BOMBO BEACH

This beach is sheltered from northeast winds and is great for swimming and surfing.



KENDALLS BEACH

This beach is ideal for swimming and is protected from the southerly breeze.



EASTS BEACH

A bather's paradise that's great for kids thanks to shelter from winds and swell. Public access at each end.



WERRI BEACH

A classic surfing beach and point which is also great for swimming.



SEVEN MILE BEACH

Great flat beach for swimming and surfing - all levels and all ages.

Completed in 2011, this modern coastal classic hugs the edge of our mighty continent while offering a mix of sealed paths, grassed tracks and beach walking. The hills are gentle enough for most fitness levels and the views – did we mention the views? Simply breathtaking. All times of day, all year round.

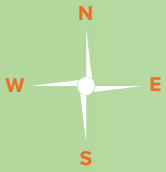
You can enjoy the Kiama Coast Walk in its entirety or simply stretch your legs on a shorter section – the choice is yours. Just don't forget your camera...

WALKING TIPS

- After heavy rain **Werri Lagoon** (Gerringong) may be open to the ocean. Check with Kiama Visitor Centre on 1300 654 262.
- Some parts of the walk are along **unprotected cliff tops**, so please do not leave children unattended.
- We recommend walking early morning to **avoid the heat of the day** during summer.
- Check for any **expected bad weather** before you leave.
- **Travel smart** – carry a water bottle, wear sunscreen and hat, and have a charged mobile phone.
- For taxi **transport to and from the walk**, call (02) 4237 7505. For train times, visit www.sydneytrains.info or download the TripView app.

- **BYO drink bottle** and utilise the free water filling stations along the way.
- Please **take all rubbish with you** or utilise the bins provided.
- **Leave only footprints**, take only memories - and some good photos!

MINNAMURRA RIVER TO KIAMA BLOWHOLE

Grade: Medium **Distance:** 8.4km **Time:** 3hrs

HIGHLIGHTS:

- **Whale watching** from Minnamurra Point

- Getting up close to the might of the **Little Blowhole**

LOVES BAY TO GERRINGONG

Grade: Medium/Hard **Distance:** 5km **Time:** 1.5hrs

- The cultural history of the **Dreaming Poles**
- Waving to the tunnel-hopping **trains**
- Spotting sea birds and **rainforest remnants**
- **Wide rock shelves** at low tide

A WHALE OF A TIME

From late May to July, humpback and Southern Right whales can be seen migrating north. From September to November, they head back south again with their calves.

NATURE WALKS

Discover how great the great outdoors can be...



1 MINNAMURRA RAINFOREST (BUDDEROO NATIONAL PARK)



Follow Tourist Drive 9 west through Jamberoo to find this rare remnant of subtropical and warm temperate rainforest. The Minnamurra Rainforest offers a glimpse of what vast areas of the Illawarra looked like before white settlement in the area. Experience the peace and serenity while viewing lyrebirds, water dragons, ancient fig trees, rock orchids, elkhorns and lush ferns.

Facilities include Visitor Centre and café. Open daily, except Christmas Day, from 9am; gates close at 5pm.

NOTE:

Park gates are locked at 5pm, last entry 4pm. \$12.00 park entry fee per vehicle per day.

RAINFOREST LOOP WALK

Time: 45mins **Distance:** 1.6km **Grade:** Medium

Explore the diverse range of plant and wildlife species. The first 500m is suitable for assisted wheelchairs.

THE FALLS WALK

Time: 1hr **Distance:** 2.6km **Grade:** Medium / steep in parts

A continuation on from the 'Loop Walk', the 2.6 km (return) 'Falls Walk' will lead you safely along the canyon cliff edge to the breathtaking upper Minnamurra Falls. This walk is slightly more challenging than the Rainforest Loop.

2 HODDLES TRACK



Time: 2hrs return **Distance:** 7km return **Grade:** Moderate / steep

Park your car at Saddleback Mountain lookout (6 km southwest of Kiama) and follow the green marking posts west, up into the escarpment to Mt Noorinan. This track was originally used to transport produce to Kiama for shipping in the 1800s and at one point stretched all the way west to Bowral. Bird watchers should keep an eye out for Crimson Rosellas, Eastern Bristlebirds and the Golden Whistler.

Note: the track is steep in places and can become slippery. Wear sensible shoes.





3 SPRING CREEK WETLANDS



Time: 30mins **Distance:** 1.5km return **Grade:** Easy

Located only a few minutes west of Kiama township, Spring Creek offers a wonderful example of rehabilitated wetlands. To get there, follow Terralong St towards Jamberoo, past the A1 highway turn-off and turn right at the 2nd roundabout into Dido St, then right into Glenbrook Drive. The entrance to the park is from a small carpark. Walk along the banks of Spring Creek to the lagoon through a variety of regenerating bushland or enjoy the birdlife from the constructed hide. You'll find numerous waterbirds and common bush birds including Golden-headed Cisticola, Black-fronted Dotterel, Black-faced Cuckoo-shrike and Mistletoebird.

4 SEVEN MILE BEACH NATIONAL PARK



Time: 30mins **Distance:** 1.5km return **Grade:** Easy

Located approximately 15 minutes south of Kiama (turn off the Princes Highway to Gerringong), between the coastal villages of Gerroa and Shoalhaven Heads.

The long sweep of Seven Mile Beach is backed by sand dunes and forest. From the end of Beach Road there is an easily accessible walkway (wheelchair friendly) to a viewing platform and the beach. Nearby is a large grassy picnic area with gas barbecues in the pleasant Bangalay Forest setting. From the picnic area there are marked walking tracks through the forest. Camping is not permitted in the park, however there are a good range of options in both Gerroa and Gerringong.



5 BARREN GROUNDS NATURE RESERVE



Time: 25mins - 2.5hrs **Grade:** Easy - Medium

Stretching from Kiama to Robertson along the top of the escarpment, this plateau reserve is a favourite for walkers and birdwatchers. Barren Grounds offers many walks taking in views of the coastline and surrounding countryside.

HERBARIUM LOOP WALK

Time: 1hr **Distance:** 2.6km **Grade:** Medium
Explore open heath and higher shrubs like flowering Banksias and Hakeas. Entrance is near the Nature Study Centre.

ILLAWARRA LOOKOUT WALK

Time: 1hr **Distance:** 2.6km **Grade:** Medium
Traverse the eastern escarpment to take in impressive coastline views.

FLYING FOX PASS WALK

Time: 1hr **Distance:** 2.6km **Grade:** Medium
A scenic track winding through heather and ending at an old flying fox from the 1940s, once used as a pulley system for transporting timber from the valley up to a sawmill.

COOKS NOSE LOOKOUT WALK

Time: 2.5hrs **Distance:** 6km return **Grade:** Medium
Travel from the picnic area to Cooks Nose on the edge of the escarpment, offering amazing views.

GRIFFITHS TRAIL & NATURAL STONE BRIDGE

Time: 3hrs **Dist:** 8km **Grade:** Medium
This loop walk meanders east through a wide variety of vegetation for approx 2 hours to reach a natural stone bridge.

KANGAROO RIDGE WALK

Time: 7-8hrs **Distance:** 19km return **Grade:** Medium
A long return walk through open heathland to the edge of the escarpment.

6 ILLAWARRA FLY TREETOP ADVENTURES



Time: 1-2hrs return **Distance:** 1500m **Grade:** Easy

Capture spectacular views of the rainforest along the Illawarra Escarpment on this 1500m walk through the beautiful warm temperate rainforest. The springboard cantilevers take you to the edge of the escarpment and a 45m high spiral tower offers panoramic views. Or for the extra adrenaline seeker, enjoy the ride from Australia's highest eco-zipline!

Facilities include a café and Visitor Centre.

Open every day 9am–5pm (last admission is at 4:15pm).

NOTE: Admission costs apply. Kiama Visitor Centre offers discounted tickets.



POINTS OF INTEREST

1 KIAMA VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE

We are located on picturesque Blowhole Point, with the lighthouse and blowhole right on our doorstep. Our friendly, knowledgeable staff can assist you with a wealth of information and services. We're open 9am-5pm daily (except Christmas Day), and we're here to make your stay as enjoyable as possible. Visit us soon!

LOCATED: Blowhole Point Road, Kiama.



2 KIAMA BLOWHOLE

This unusual rock formation spouts spectacular plumes of water high into the air with a great 'whoosh'. View this spectacular sight from the viewing platform, which is wheelchair accessible, or walk on the pathway to obtain a closer view. It's most impressive when winds blow from the south-east.

LOCATED: Blowhole Point Road, near the Lighthouse and close to the Kiama Visitor Centre.



3 PILOT'S COTTAGE MUSEUM

Step into Kiama's past and discover the maritime and regional museum. Built in 1881, the restored Pilot's Cottage provides information on history relating to shipping, the cedar industry and basalt quarries in the region.

LOCATED: Next to the Kiama Visitor Centre on Blowhole Point Road. Open Friday to Monday, 11am – 3pm.



4 ROCKPOOLS

Situated in beautiful positions along our coastline, our four tidal rock pools are all unique and offer a safe and relaxing swimming experience away from the surf breaks.

LOCATED: North end of Kiama's Black Beach Reserve, northern side of Kiama's Blowhole Point, South Werri Beach and Boat Harbour Gerringong.



5 KIAMA LIBRARY AND FAMILY HISTORY CENTRE

Kiama Library, located just across from the train station, offers a modern community hub - featuring high ceilings, a large natural light-filled magazine and newspaper reading room, excellent children's area and free NBN Wi-Fi throughout.

LOCATED: 7 Railway Parade, Kiama.



6 HISTORIC TERRACE HOUSES

Originally built as housing for the local quarry workers in 1886, these National Trust classified historic buildings now house a unique selection of crafts, collectables, clothing and eateries. Behind the Terraces, discover the Sandstone Walk, featuring more delightful shops and services.

LOCATED: Collins Street, Kiama.



7 KIAMA LEISURE CENTRE

The centre features two indoor heated pools, a gym, aerobic area, personal training, kids dance and basketball. It also offers school holiday activities, kinder gym, child minding, spa and sauna. Visitors welcome.

LOCATED: Havilah Place, off Terralong Street, Kiama.



8

SPRING CREEK WETLANDS AND BIRD HIDE

This area features an observation hide located between the lagoon and freshwater lake that enables a close up view of waterbirds, including Cormorants, Moorhens, Coots, Swans and many other local species.

LOCATED: Park at Glenbrook Drive, off Dido Street, Kiama and follow the signs to the Bird Hide and the walking track.



9

BONAIRA NATIVE GARDENS

These gardens feature established rainforest species. Explore this magical and peaceful oasis by foot or bike and pack a picnic. The walk takes 20 minutes and passes a monument dedicated to the Wadi Wadi people - the local Aboriginal tribe.

LOCATED: Access via Bonaira or Reid Street, Kiama.

LITTLE BLOWHOLE

A little bit harder to find, but well worth the effort. See vigorous sprays of water emanating from a natural rocky cove. The spray reaches remarkable heights and can be viewed from a viewing platform or on the rocky foreshore. From here you can walk around to the south to Easts Beach. Works best when winds blow from the north east.

LOCATED: Off Tingira Crescent, Kiama.



11

DRY STONE WALLS

Nearly 400 dry stone walls have been identified in the Municipality. Most were constructed over 100 years ago and are attributed mainly to Thomas Newing who built walls for over 60 years.

LOCATED: Throughout the area, however Saddleback Mountain Road offers some great examples.

SADDLEBACK MOUNTAIN LOOKOUT

On a clear day, take in the view from Cronulla in the north to Milton in the South. While the north-facing viewing platform (off main car park) is excellent, be sure to check out the recently opened southern platform further up from the main car park.

LOCATED: On Jack Cleary Memorial Drive off Saddleback Mountain Road, Kiama.

JAMBEROO PUB & JOHNNY WARREN MUSEUM

Not just your average pub. Family owned and operated, this pub boasts not only Jamberoo history, but also the Johnny Warren room and sporting memorabilia from all codes.

LOCATED: Jamberoo Road, Jamberoo (10 minutes west of Kiama).

JERRARA DAM

A picturesque reserve established on a nine hectare dam that was once Kiama's main water supply.

LOCATED: 29 Mount Brandon Rd, Jerrara



15

MINNAMURRA RAINFOREST

See Lyrebirds, Whipbirds, Yellow Robins, Water Dragons and ancient figs as you take the Loop Walk (1.6km elevated walkway, wheelchair accessible for the first 500m) or take on the Falls Walk (2.6kms) with views onto the canopy below. Featuring visitor centre, retail shop, café and picnic/BBQ area.

LOCATED: On Minnamurra Falls Road, Jamberoo, 15 kms west of Kiama township.

POINTS OF INTEREST

16 JAMBEROO ACTION PARK

NSW's favourite water-based theme park, offers a full day of family fun and adventure, with plenty of rides and attractions including Funnel Web, Taipan, Banjo's Billabong, The Perfect Storm and Outback Bay wave pool. Open September through until April, from 10am to 5pm. Check website for opening days.

LOCATED: Jamberoo Road, Jamberoo, 15 minutes from Kiama township.



17 BARREN GROUNDS NATURE RESERVE

The reserve is loved by both walkers and birdwatchers, particularly in spring, when it is a mass of wildflowers. It offers a range of walks including an easy 2km return walk to Illawarra Lookout or the 8km 'Griffith's Trail' circular walk, both offering great views.

LOCATED: Access from Jamberoo Mountain Road, about a 10 minute drive west of Jamberoo.



18 ILLAWARRA FLY TREETOP ADVENTURES

A unique 1500 metre walk through temperate rainforest joins the springboard cantilevers suspended 25 metres above the forest floor and a breathtaking 45m high spiral tower. Or for the adrenaline seeker, enjoy Australia's highest eco zipline!

LOCATED: 40 minutes west of Kiama on Knights Hill Rd, Knights Hill.



19 NELLIES GLEN

Relax with a picnic and the sights and sounds of nearby waterfalls. An idyllic swimming hole, great place for bird watching and exploring brightly coloured fungi and orchids when in season.

LOCATED: On Cloonty Road off Jamberoo Mountain Road within the Budderoo National Park.



20 LOOKOUTS

Along with Saddleback Mountain Lookout our region offers other vistas to awaken your senses. Be sure to visit Mount Pleasant Lookout at Gerringong; Illawarra and Cooks Nose on the Barren Grounds Plateau and Jamberoo Lookout in Budderoo National Park.

LOCATED: Reference number 20 on the map.



21 WINERIES & BREWERIES

The Kiama area is home to Crooked River Wines, with year-round events and a restaurant onsite; family-run Roselea Vineyard, boasting spectacular views; and Gerringong's Stoic Brewing. Grab a Shoalhaven Coast Winery brochure for extra options.

LOCATED: Reference number 21 on the map.

22 KINGSFORD SMITH LOOKOUT & SEVEN MILE BEACH NATIONAL PARK

With panoramic views of Seven Mile Beach, this lookout commemorates the first commercial flight from Australia to New Zealand by Sir Charles Kingsford Smith in 1933 which took place on the long smooth beach below.

LOCATED: 1 Headland Drive, Gerroa.



23 GRANTIES MAZE

Granties Maze consists of 2000 trees planted to create a network of paths designed as a puzzle. Discover archery, mini golf, bumper cars, paddle boats, skirmish and more at this unique fun park.

LOCATED: 25 Donovan Road, Foxground



24 BOMBO HEADLAND

A legacy of blue metal quarrying in the 1880s and 1900s has left us with a moonscape of basalt walls and columns. These are a regular back-drop to video clips and television advertisements.

LOCATED: North Bombo Beach access off Hutchison Street or via Cliff Drive.



25 BONEYARD

A sheltered pebbly beach located on the northern side of Bombo peninsula. Popular secluded spot for a picnic, snorkelling or standup paddleboarding. Surfers can also be found on the right-hand reef break.

LOCATED: At the southern end of Cliff Drive, Kiama Downs, or accessed by foot from North Bombo.



26 CATHEDRAL ROCKS

This distinctive rock formation is part of our geologically fascinating coastline. Years of erosion have shaped these volcanic rocks into delightful sculptured forms. Be sure to take your camera as the views and spectacular rocky outcrop is a great spot for a picture.

LOCATED: 3km north of Kiama Township at the southern end of Jones Beach, with access from Cliff Drive, Kiama Downs.



27 MINNAMURRA RIVER & HEADLAND

Translating to 'plenty of fish' Minnamurra River is not only renowned for fishing but also a popular and safe swimming, snorkelling and kayaking spot. Take the Kiama Coast Walk south up the headland offering spectacular views of Stack Island, the ocean and Minnamurra River.

LOCATED: James Oates Reserve, access from Charles Avenue.



28 GOLF COURSES

Playing a round has never been more fun with three completely different courses. Choose from Jamberoo Golf Course, with its rural charm; a challenging seaside course at Gerringong, offering spectacular ocean and mountain views; or the shorter, flatter all weather course at Kiama Downs.

LOCATED: Reference number 28 on the map.



29 KILLALEA STATE PARK

Declared a National Surfing Reserve in 2009, Killalea offers two pristine surfing beaches "The Farm" and "Mystics". The Park features 250 hectares of pristine coastal reserve with walks, picnic areas and BBQs. Camping facilities and a kiosk are also available.

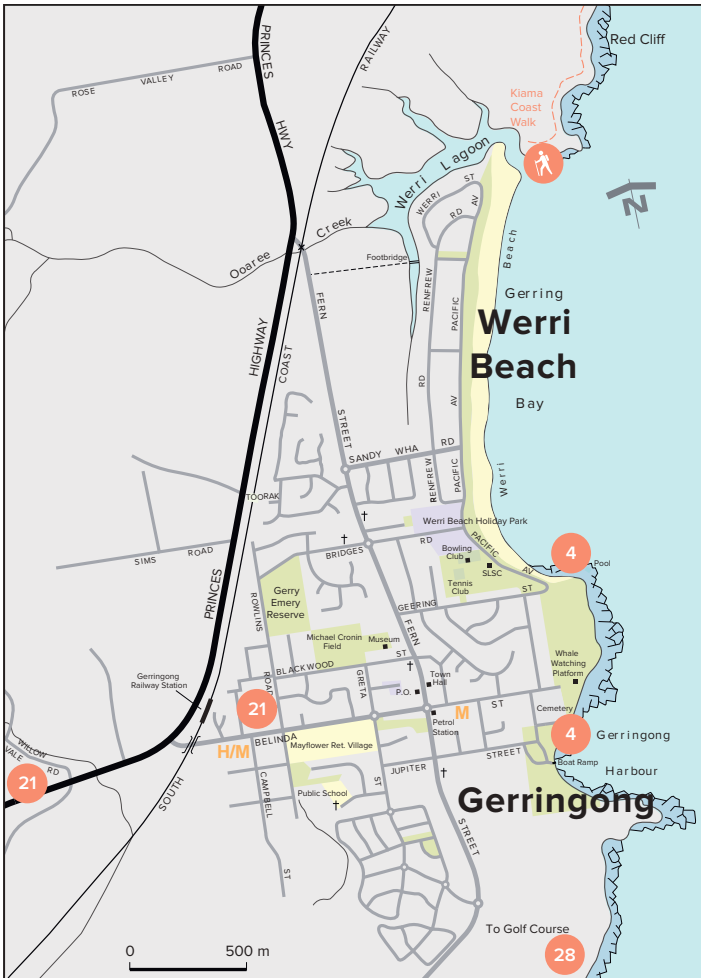
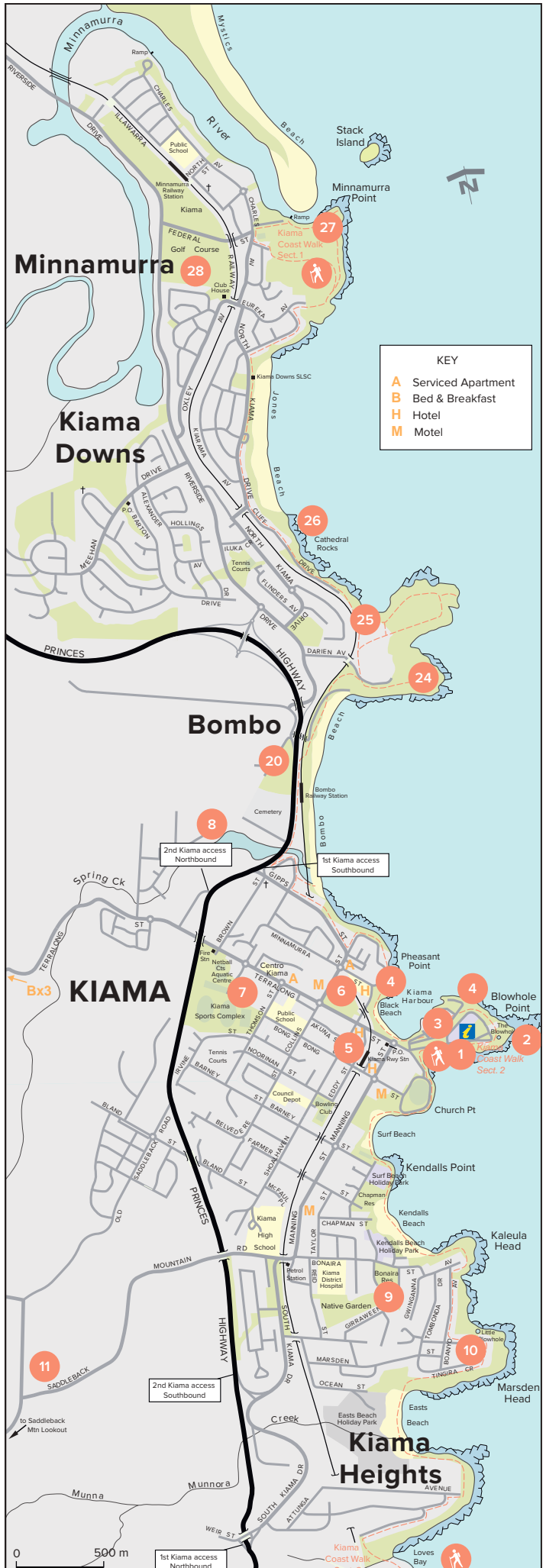
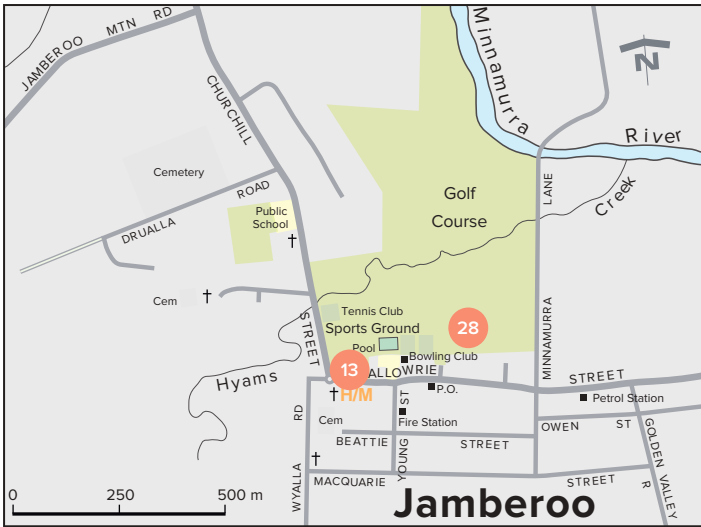
LOCATED: Heading north, take Shell Cove exit and follow the signs.



30 HARS AVIATION MUSEUM

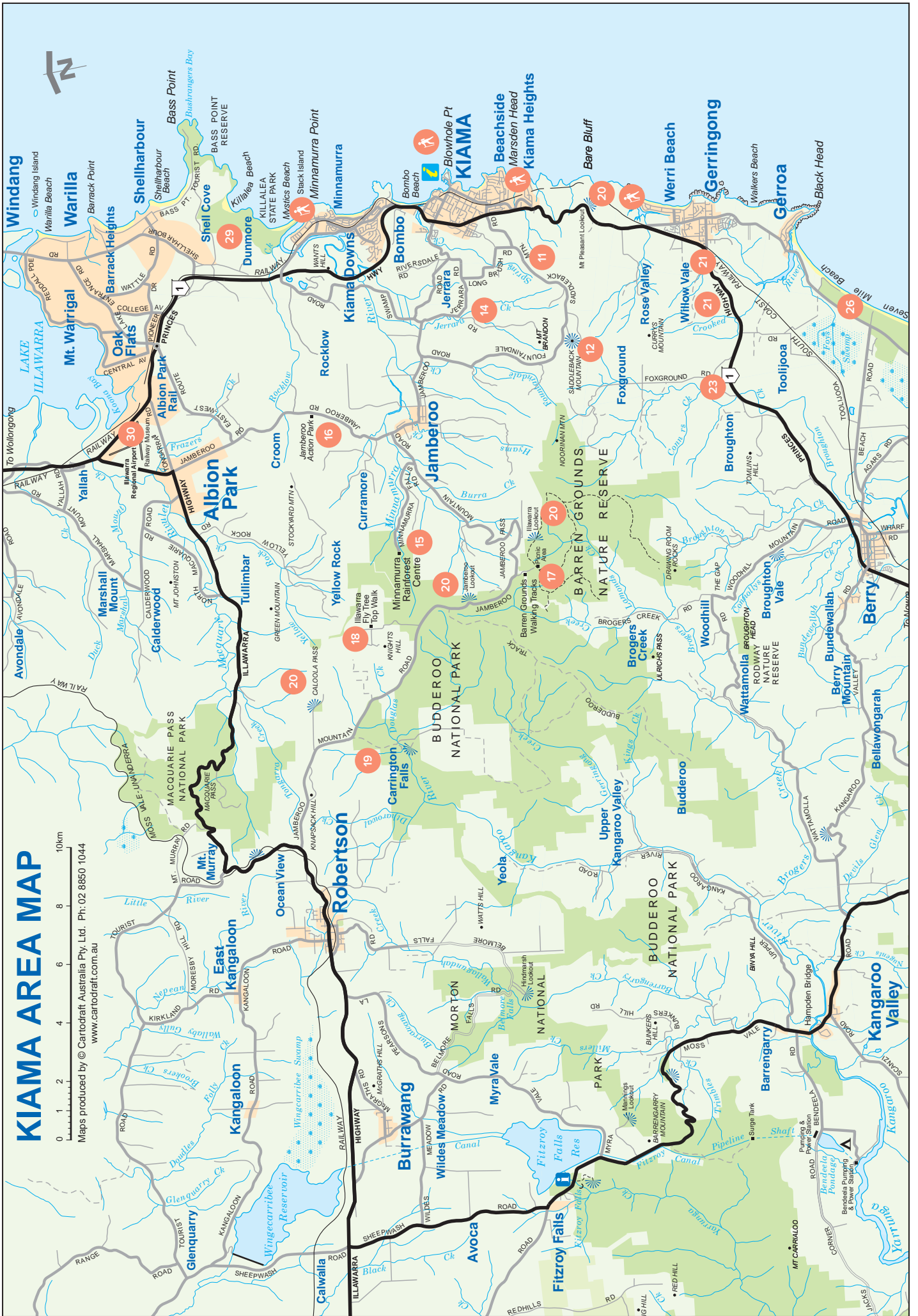

WHALES

From May to November, spot Humpback and Southern Right whales as they migrate up and down the east coast.

With such a botanically-blessed backdrop as the one we have in Kiama, it's little wonder that it's not just humans that enjoy this happy habitat. An abundance of animals inhabit the land, sea and air, framed (or sometimes camouflaged) by many distinctive native species of plants and trees.

Even the casual observer will find something unique in our diverse slice of coastal, swampy and rainforested landscape. As for bird watchers and bona fide nature "frothers" – well, the Kiama area is a true garden of delights! Scan these pages for highlights to look out for during your stay...



NORFOLK ISLAND PINE

Signature trees along our coastline, many were planted originally in the 1800s for ship masts.



STINGRAY

Dark and pointy but mostly passive, these sea creatures can often be spotted around Kiama jetty.



CABBAGE TREE PALM

Leftovers of the sub-tropical rainforest that was once here from the mountains to the sea.



EASTERN GROUND PARROT

This endangered, shy and strikingly beautiful bird inhabits Barren Grounds Nature Reserve.



ILLAWARRA FLAME TREE

An iconic and attractive native rainforest tree, bursting into flaming colour from November to February.



LYREBIRD

Nature's most talented mimicker, it imitates everything from other birds to car alarms and chainsaws!



EASTERN PYGMY POSSUM

This tiny nocturnal tree dwelling marsupial enjoys feeding on pollen and nectar from Banksia flowers.

Even small changes to an ecosystem can upset the **fragile balance**. That's why we ask that when exploring the region, you always respect the natural environment by taking only photographs and leaving only footprints.



MORETON BAY FIG

Highly distinctive local native with large branches, wide canopy and thick buttress roots.



PELICAN

An iconic and regular sight around Kiama and Gerringong harbours, timing the local fisherman's return.



DOLPHINS

Often seen in groups and always smiling playfully at beach breaks around the Kiama area.



WHITE BELLIED SEA EAGLE

A bird of prey, it is readily distinguished by its contrasting crisp-white and ashy-grey plumage.



WILDFLOWERS

Spring is announced very colourfully in places like Bonaira Native Gardens, Barren Grounds and along the Kiama Coast Walk.



ECHIDNA

This cute native animal is just one of two mammals in the world that lays eggs (the other being the platypus).



PIED OYSTER CATCHER

You'll spot these threatened wading birds on the coastal rock platforms around the Kiama area.



GREY HEADED FLYING FOX

Spring Creek Wetland in Kiama is home to a roosting colony of Australia's largest bat – this threatened grey headed species.

DRIVING

TOURIST DRIVE 9

Taking in some of the best views and roads in the region, this drive takes around 2 hours, starting in Kiama and winding its way through to the Southern Highlands via Jamberoo Mountain Rd to Robertson.

Stops can be made along the way at Jamberoo township, Minnamurra Rainforest (small signposted detour), Illawarra Fly Treetop Adventure and Nellies Glen.

Continue on to the town of Robertson for coffee, collectables and antiques. Then either return the way you came or down via Macquarie Pass and through Albion Park.

SADDLEBACK MOUNTAIN LOOKOUT

This quick drive is a simple one to “get your bearings”. From the Kiama Visitor Information Centre, follow Manning Street approx 2km up to the service station. Turn right at the roundabout and then right again onto Saddleback Mountain Road (next to Kiama High School).

From here it’s approx 1.5km to a junction (turn left) and a further 4km up to the lookout, with impressive views across Kiama, Gerringong and Jamberoo as you climb and from the top (ample parking available). The final 500m is the steepest – take care in wet or icy conditions.

GRAND PACIFIC DRIVE

The Grand Pacific Drive encompasses some of the most spectacular scenery and coastline in New South Wales and Australia. Starting south of Sydney at the entrance to the Royal National Park, the 140km drive takes you through coastal rainforests, quaint seaside villages and traverses the iconic 665 metre Sea Cliff Bridge (pictured).

Grand Pacific Drive then makes its way south into the bustling city of Wollongong and through to the beautiful coastal towns of Shellharbour and Kiama, passing rolling hills, wineries and dairy farms on its way to the Shoalhaven.

To experience the Sea Cliff Bridge from Kiama, follow the Grand Pacific Drive north, allowing approx 1 hour driving time (one way).

CYCLING

Riding a bike allows you to go places that you simply can’t in a car. It also gives you the chance to fully appreciate the natural sights and sounds around you. You choose the pace – fast and lycra-clad, bumpy and off road, or a more gentle ‘bell and basket’ vibe, cruising sunny pathways and resting under the occasional big tree. This is the life!

Here in Kiama, we offer a taste of all three. Road cyclists and mountain bikers will love traversing the many hills and winding roads of Jamberoo and its steep surrounds. And casual cyclists can enjoy a laid back scenic pedal as they meander along the many shared paths and marked cycleways throughout the region. Remember to wear a helmet and respect other road users at all times.
