The Wodi Wodi are the First Nations custodians of the Illawarra region, including Kiama and surrounding areas. The Wodi Wodi are Dharawal language speakers, and their country extends from Botany Bay in the north, to Campbelltown and Moss Vale in the west, and as far south as the Shoalhaven River and Jervis Bay.

Dharawal people travelled throughout the region, depending on the season and their purpose. They cared for country, and harvested only what was needed, and they sometimes met with and exchanged food, materials and artefacts with people from other language groups - fish, oysters, water fowl, mutton fish (abalone), grubs and ochre were particularly important and valuable.

Try introducing yourself in the Dharawal language:

Nagangbi ngayagang (your name) = Hello I am Nganung njindigang = Who are you? Nandawanjini = See you later

Dharawal Seasons

Burran (hot and dry) Marrai'gang (wet becoming cool) April – June Burrugin (cold and frosty) Wiritjiribin (cold and windy) Ngoonungi (cool becoming warm) September – October Parra'dowee (warm and wet)

January - March June – July July - August November – December

The middens lining the riverbank of the Minnamurra River are evidence of how the river was harvested for fish and shellfish over millennia, and midden sites can also be found at Bass Point, Minnamurra Point, Gerroa and Gerringong.

Our original storytellers.

Traditional stories tell of the Wodi Wodi's journey in canoes from the north to the mouth of Lake Illawarra, in the time when the Spiritual Ancestors were animals (we call them totems today). They brought with them the sacred Dharawal (cabbage tree palm) - which still feature's in our local landscape today.

Baiame is the sacred sky-hero who led the Wodi Wodi to their country, formed the natural features of the land, and gave them their social laws and rites. Totems of the Wodi Wodi include the magpie, lyrebird, pelican, satin bowerbird, red-bellied blacksnake, and lace monitor, and these form the heart of culture, and how the people relate to, care for and manage the land.





Getting here & around

By road

90 minutes from Sydney 2hrs 45 minutes from Canberra

I might be biased, but I'm pretty sure I live and work in the best place on earth.



Towns & villages

The Kiama region boasts a number of towns and villages, each with its own unique character.

From Minnamurra River in the north, Gerroa in the south, and Jamberoo in the west, there are a wealth of wonders to discover, whether you're here for a brief stopover, a long weekend or an extended escape.

Bombo & Minnamurra

Breathtaking scenery? Check. Sheltered swim spots? Check. Spectacular walking trails? Check.

Beginning at the mouth of the Minnamurra River and heading south, **you'll find some of the region's most unbelievable natural landscapes.** Arriving at Bombo Headland and Cathedral Rocks might feel like you've landed on the moon, but you're still earthbound (we promise). There's a reason this part of our coastline is loved by photographers and film directors alike, **it's truly unlike anywhere else.** See page 62 for the insta-lineup.

Take things at your own pace here.

At Minnamurra, the sheltered waterways where the river meets the ocean are ideal for swimming, kayaking, paddle boarding and fishing. Head on up to the Minnamurra Headland whalewatching platform for seasonal sightings of these majestic creatures, and great views year-round. Enjoy the greens of the local golf course, take to the surf at popular beaches, or set off on the iconic Kiama Coast Walk.

Gerringong & Gerroa

With surf as far as the eye can see, rolling hills and ocean pools, the twin towns of Gerringong and Gerroa deal exclusively in laid-back lunches, wonderous walks and glamorous getaways.

From the fresh air freedom of beaches that stretch for miles, to the carefully crafted flavours of locally distilled beer and wines, you'll find your fix, whatever your vibe.

In Gerringong, **enjoy views over Werri Beach** from cafes and resturants with cult followings, meander through galleries and boutique shops, or enjoy fun for the whole family at beaches, parks and pools.

Gerringong is the southern extremity of the Kiama Coast Walk, so take off those hiking boots and put your feet up for a while. You won't want to leave.

To the south, Gerroa is a gem atop the golden crown of Seven Mile Beach National Park, a favourite destination for families, swimmers, windsurfers and surfers, and a top-notch spot for **braving those surf breaks for the first time.**



Jamberoo

Whether you're looking for quaint winding lanes, boundless character and country hospitality, wonderful wildlife, or an adrenalin fix, **you'll find it here.**

Jamberoo is just a short drive inland from our picturesque coastline, but feels a world away. A refreshing mix of rolling rural hills, lush rainforest and the rush of heart-racing attractions.

Feel the spray of lively waterfalls on a visit to Minnamurra Rainforest's boardwalks, or get your heart racing on immense water slides and rides at the iconic Jamberoo Action Park.

Lace up your hiking boots and hit the trails, with beautiful walking tracks, secluded swimming holes, National Parks, and an abundance of wildlife to discover. Drive along country roads adorned by hedges, hills and dairy-cow dotted fields. Or take to the heights, for treetop walking and ziplining.

When it's time to refuel, **head to one of the picture-ready picnic spots**, or visit the local pub to debrief over home-cooked meals.

Kiama

Kiama has graduated from sleepy-seaside-town to happeningregional-hub in recent years. A long-time stopover for weary travellers and day-trippers, it's a destination in its own right and the perfect base for exploring our region.

Start with a visit to the Blowhole, where nature puts on a show of varying magnitudes - from a whisper to a roar. Here, you'll understand why Kiama was known as 'where the sea makes a noise' by its traditional custodians – the Wodi Wodi people.

Throughout the year you'll find festivals and markets on the charming foreshore, just a short walk from the bustling main street packed with eateries specialising in local produce, hip bars, comfy cafes, traditional pubs, and ice-creameries.

Browse the local shops, full of beautifully sourced treasures, relax in the park, hit the beach, take in harbourside stroll or explore the local heritage.

Not sure where to begin? The Visitor Information Centre on Blowhole Point near the Lighthouse is a safe bet.



History & heritage

Beyond the holiday nostalgia, the Kiama region has a rich past - with stories around very corner, just waiting to be told...

Before European settlers, the Wodi Wodi were the first to call the area home, with a nomadic way of life that followed the trail of food throughout the seasons, thanks to an abundance of native flora and fauna, seafood and

In 1797, George Bass was the first European to spot Kiama from his ship, sailing by Blowhole Point and describing hearing the sea rushing through the rocks with 'the most tremendous noise'.

In the 19th Century, convicts and ticket of leave men were used as cedar cutters, felling the timber from the local Red Cedar forests to be transported to Sydney to feed the building industry's insatiable appetite. Soon after, the rich basalt of the coast was also mined, bringing more people and trade to the area.

What started as an idyllic oasis of lush rainforest vegetation and bountiful seas for the local Wodi Wodi people, eventually became a bustling transport and agricultural hub, with Kiama's harbour and links to the highlands making it an ideal junction for industry and farming.

Let the light shine

freshwater

Kiama Lighthouse is an iconic part of our townscape, located on Blowhole Point and rising 36.5 metres above sea level. Established in 1887, it was an essential beacon for sailors along our coast, and still stands proudly today.

The lighthouse isn't open to the public, but you can find out more about its history at the **Pilot's Cottage Museum**, also located on Blowhole Point. Open on weekends and run by volunteers, here you'll learn about the region's land and maritime history, and get a glimpse of the artefacts from our past.



Step back in time

Take a walking tour of our town's historic sites with the Kiama Historic Walk which maps and highlights key pieces of local history. Grab a copy of the map from the Visitor Information Centre, or download one of the free digital walking tours available via the Kiama Library. For a truly immersive historical experience, time your visit with the steam train and discover the romance of train travel from days go by.

A-stone-ishing walls

The hills and valleys surrounding Kiama are criss-crossed by nearly 400 heritage-listed, hand-built dry stone walls, many of them crafted by Thomas Newing from local volcanic stone over a period of 60 years (1860s-1920s). As the area was cleared for farming and livestock, these traditional stone walls were built in the style of those found across Britain.



Local legends: Sally Fitzgibbons

We caught up with Pro Surfer Sally Fitzgibbons, who grew up in our region and still calls it home.

Tell us about your love for the Kiama region?

I just love coming home here - it's my anchor. I'm so often travelling the world far and wide, but my heart feels connected to this place, and I'm so fortunate to have grown up here. I loved earning my surfing stripes on the amazing local surf beaches.

What are your favourite things to do when you're home?

Obviously heading out on the waves - sometimes I meet local young groms, other times it's tourists who are so excited to be here.

I also love running on the local tracks - the Kiama Coast Walk is stunning, and so are the national parks and Minnamurra Rainforest. From early mornings to after dark, there are so many opportunities to spot local wildlife too.

What's your recommendation for first-time visitors?

Get out there and try something new! If you're keen to try surfing, there are some great local surf schools, or even just head to a local patrolled beach and feel that connection to the land and water.

Put on your hiking boots and check out the trails. Hinterland or coast, we've got the best of both worlds.

Any good surf spots for beginners?

For me, the whole region is an absolute paradise and playground when it comes to waves. Obviously, I can access the more experienced breaks, but if you're starting out there are plenty of great nooks and crannies. Shallow sand banks are great for younger kids or adult learners. Stick to the patrolled beaches and ask the lifeguards for any advice on rips so you know what's happening.

Mid beach at Jones' Beach and the northern end of Bombo beach are great. I learnt to surf at the river mouth at Gerroa, so it's always got a special place in my heart.

What about favourite spots on land?

Kiama is a great place to explore, starting at the blowhole where you can look out to the horizon for dolphins, whales, sea eagles and seals - the locals who join me in my daily surfing when I am home. Then wander down to the ocean pools or explore the town. Let the day take you where it takes you, be open to seeing what you find.

The area is home to some of the best coffee shops, restaurants and wineries - keep it casual or dress up - anything goes here. There's a great range of coffee shops to try, many that share some of our amazing local organic produce, so make sure you get amongst it.

Visit the local markets, enjoy the sunshine - you'll be greeted by nothing but smiles and good times. You're always welcome here.

From spectacular landscapes and iconic walking trails, to native wildlife and breathtaking natural displays, nature's wonders are plentiful here.



No need for tickets or popcorn, the natural show of Kiama's Blowholes is available daily, and is a must-see for any visitor to the region.

The Blowholes

Sometimes a hum, sometimes a roar, the two Blowholes in Kiama are natural rock formations that interact with the ocean to create impressive and powerful displays.

A lesson in history

The Blowholes started forming around 260 million years ago (that's well before dinosaurs), when basalt lava flowed into the sea, forming these coastal rock formations. Over time, the power of the ocean eroded the softer rock inside the sea caves, creating the holes of the blowholes.

The blowholes were well known by local indigenous tribes, who called the larger blowhole *Khanterinte*, and they're the reason the translation of the name Kiama is "where the sea makes a noise". The first European recording of the blowholes was in 1797, when George Bass sailed past.

How it works

Under the right conditions, big waves force their way into the natural cave formations in the rock, compressing air inside the rear chamber. This compressed air then acts like a drill, powering the incoming waves vertically and forcing water up through the blowhole.

The size and force of the water coming out of the blowholes varies, it's not about tides, it's actually influenced by the sea swell and the wind direction.



Vantage points

The larger (and more famous) Kiama Blowhole is located next to the Lighthouse and Visitor Information Centre on Kiama's Blowhole Point. With a 2.5 metre opening, it's been

recorded at heights of more than 30 metres. Beware, visitors (and their cameras) are often drenched by the giant displays and wild sea spray!

Little Blowhole is smaller, but more consistent, and a well-kept local secret. You can access it via the Kiama Coast Walk or from Tingira Crescent.



Both blowhole locations have parking and are paved with access to the top platform for wheelchairs.

Our dramatic coastline

Cathedral Rocks

The towering basalt rock formations at the southern end of Jones' Beach are known as Cathedral Rocks, with their mighty pillars resembling the towering medieval structures of its namesake. A favourite with photographers.

Bombo Headland

The otherworldly pinnacles and shapes of Bombo Headland are a legacy from local mining for blue metal in the 19th and early 20th centuries. Get ready to feel like you're walking on the moon – BYO space suit.

Ocean pools

Our coastline is home to a number of ocean pools, carved out of rockshelves, and influenced by our stunning geology. Bring your swimmers. pack a lunch and your sense of adventure and wade in your own secluded paradise along our coast.

Nature walks & wildlife encounters

Hear the rustle of the wind in the leaves as you're guided by the steady sound of your feet on the earth. Inhale. Exhale. Discover just how great the outdoors can be.

From gentle strolls, to challenging hikes, bring your walking shoes and see where our nature trails can take you.

Saddleback Mountain & Hoddles Track

Time: 3hrs Distance: 8km return Grade: 4 (hard)

Originally used to transport produce to Kiama from the highlands for shipping in the 1800s, this is a challenging walk into the escarpment, taking you up to Mt Noorinan. Bird watchers in particular will delight in our feathered locals: Crimson Rosellas, Eastern Bristlebirds and the Golden Whistler are all common sightings.

Seven Mile Beach

Time: 2-3hrs Distance: 4km/6km return Grade: 3 (medium)

Starting from the Beach Road picnic area, the Waterline Track or Sand Track heads north towards Gerroa, taking in dune Blackbutt and Banagalay forests. Return the same way or via the sandy stretch of Seven Mile Beach.

Bombo Headland

Time: 1hr Grade: 3 (medium)

A short walk, but a transformative journey. Wonder as you wander amongst clusters of hexagonal basalt columns, a legacy of blue metal quarrying from centuries past. Starting from Bombo Beach, you'll take in views including Cathedral Rocks, Minnamurra Headland and Jones Beach.



Minnamurra Rainforest

Time: 45min/2hrs Distance: 1.6km / 4.2km Grade: 3/4 (medium/hard)

Get up close and personal with rare remnants of subtropical and warm temperate rainforest, at this award-winning attraction. Begin at the information centre, before taking on one or both of the walks - either an accessible shorter walk (The Lyrebird Loop), or a more challenging circuit (The Falls Walk). Keep an eye out for water dragons, bowerbirds, ladybirds and ancient rainforest flora.



Pack the binoculars - kids will love exploring these flat and easy walking trails, and spotting wildlife in the surrounding shrubs, grasses and trees.

Carrington Falls

Time: 30min Distance: 600m Grade: 3 (medium)

Pack a picnic and cool off by the cascades, waterholes and rockpools in this very special part of Budderoo National Park. The Carrington Falls loop walk is a short and scenic walk, with other short walks signposted from Thomas Place picnic area.


Barren Grounds

Time: 30min - 3hrs Distance: 2km - 8km Grade: 3 Medium

This plateau reserve is popular with walkers and birdwatchers alike. There are a number of walks taking in spectacular views of the coastline and countryside. The Illawarra Lookout Walk leads to a viewpoint of the Illawarra Plateau and coastline below.



National Parks and Reserves are areas protected for future generations and are some of the last refuges for many of Australia's vulnerable species. We urge you to respect this environment as you explore and remain on structured paths and trails.

Wonderful wildlife

Flora

From the totem-pole trunks of cabbage tree palms, which are remnants of the rainforest which once covered our region, to the distinguished heights of the Norfolk Island pines found along the coastline, to the bright red of Illawarra Flame Trees, tall trees are part of our local landscape.

During spring, head to Barren Grounds to see wildflowers in bloom, a carpet of colour not to be missed.

Land-lovers

Land-based wildlife abounds, from the shy Echidna, to the Swamp Wallaby and Eastern Pygmy Possum. Along inland waterways you might also see Eastern Water Dragons, Blue-Tongue Lizards and Long-Necked Tortoises, frogs and more.


Look up (and down)

Keep your eyes on the skies for beautiful birdlife – Pelicans are often spotted floating around Kiama and Gerringong harbours, while White Bellied Sea Eagles with their crisp-white and ash-grey plumage soar above, and Eastern Spinebills dart around the more wooded areas of our region. On the ground you might see the elaborate tail of the Lyrebird, or the beautiful and endangered Eastern Ground Parrot, sometimes seen at Barren Grounds reserve.

In the waves whale watchers, rejoice! You'll find some of the best land-based whale-watching on the East Coast in our region, with Humpback and Southern Right whales migrating up and down the coast for six months of the year. Dolphins and stingrays are also common sightings in the calm waters of our harbours and inlets.



Thrill seekers

Think we're all about serene seaside locations and quiet landscapes? Think again. While we do boast plenty of opportunities for rest and relaxation, we're just as generous with the thrills and spills.

Jamberoo Action Park

From October to April, the crowds flock to Jamberoo Action Park. This season sees the debut of their newest attraction, Velocity Falls, NSW's largest family-owned water park takes water slides to the next level, with heart-racing drops, spins and splashes, its guaranteed to leave you gasping for more and queuing up again, and again, and again.



Heated shallow pools and mini waterslides of Billabong Beach ensure even the littlest adventurers can splash safely, while kids big and small chase a more serious adrenaline rush.



Live the high life

Take to the trees at Illawarra Fly Treetop Adventures, home to an incredible treetop walk experience and Australia's highest zipline. Strap yourself in for amazing views, with panoramas across the ancient forests, dramatic mountains and the blue Pacific Ocean, from 710 metres above sea level.



This treetop adventure is an experience to share with the whole family, suitable for kids aged four and over.

Bird's eye view

Get a new perspective on our region with a scenic helicopter flight, taking in the diverse landscapes, coastal formations, rolling farmland and pretty towns and villages. All while feeling like an absolute VIP.



Need for speed




Werri Beach shared path is a 4km return route, great for kids to practice their cycling skills or stretch their legs on a scenic ride.





On to Robertson (affectionately known as the 'green heart of the highlands') and from here you can choose to return via Macquarie Pass

or continue on an extended loop taking in the magnificent Fitzroy Falls, quaint Kangaroo Valley, grabbing a donut from Berry on the way back to the coast.

O Cathedral Rocks

This natural wonder is an absolute showstopper! Located at the southern end of Jones Beach, the formation of towering basalt columns dates back millions of years.

Cabbage Tree Palms

A leisurely drive from Kiama to Jamberoo will provide numerous opportunities to photograph the area's rolling green fields, friendly faces of local farm animals and the iconic cabbage tree palms, a legacy from the Wodi Wodi, traditional owners of the Dharawal Country.

O Carrington Falls

Three lookouts, all offering slightly different perspectives, means that no matter where the light is, you're sure to get the perfect shot as the water plunges to the rocks 50 metres below.

Seven Mile Beach

This is one of the longest beaches on the NSW South Coast, stretching over 10 kilometres from Gerroa at its northern tip to the small town of Shoalhaven Heads in the south.


