



Between September and April, make a splash at NSW's favourite water theme park — right in our backyard!




Cathedral Rocks

Transport yourself to another world, amid the rock formations and natural erosion of this geological playground.


This southern stretch of endless golden sand offers something for everyone take surf lessons with Surf Camp Australia, enjoy a refreshing swim, or explore the National Park walks.

A brilliant way to greet the new day. Cool off in one of the four saltwater ocean pools across Kiama and Gerringong.



Ocean Pools

Forming Kiama's northern border, this is a family-friendly swimming, snorkelling, boating, paddleboarding and fishing haven!

Meet our famous blon/holes

Can you hear that? The unmistakable "WOOSH" of this geological marvel has been 260 million years in the making long before the age of the dinosaurs! Shaped by volcanic forces and sculpted by the ocean's persistence, these two frothy, thunderous wonders are nature's own showstoppers.

Much like the blowholes of the whales that migrate along our coast, the **Kiama Blowhole** is essentially one large vent, which, under pressure, will force a jet of water high into the air (up to 30 metres or eight storeys high in the right conditions!) each time it takes a 'breath'.

This unique landmark sits on a natural headland, visited by Aboriginal tribes for centuries and given the name 'Khanterinte'. The first European to make a splash in this area was George Bass in 1797 — and some 228 years later this site is now a hive of activity — home to a bustling harbour, cafes, ocean baths, walking tracks, historic **Pilot's Cottage**, lighthouse and more.

Stock up on maps, brochures, bookings and information at Kiama Visitor Information Centre, just a 100m walk from the lighthouse and Kiama Blowhole.

But wait, there's more! Besides the main **Kiama Blowhole** (pictured above), there is also a second **Little Blowhole** (pictured left) approximately 2km to the south — a short drive to Tingira Crescent or stroll along the Kiama Coast Walk.

Fun facts



Did you know?

The name 'Kiama' can be translated as "where the sea makes a noise".

The Little Blowhole is often active when its big sibling is not. Catch them on a good day, and they'll really blow your mind!

Are they coin operated?

Only on 1 April! ...These natural features rely on the right sea swell (not tides) to put on a good show. Let's hope they're feeling 'swell' during your visit.



What hours are the Blowholes open? From 8am until — just kidding, they're open all

the time and are free to visit.

Both of Kiama's blowholes have accessible viewing platforms suitable for visitors with limited mobility.

Once upon a time

To fully understand the story of Kiama, it's worth first exploring the echoes of the past. Ours is a rich and layered history, dotted with milestones that make us what we are today.

An abundant land

For thousands of years, Kiama was both a destination and crossroads for the nomadic **Wodi Wodi people of the Dharawal Nation**. They travelled regularly with the seasons, making use of this region's seasonal flora and fauna, freshwater fish and seafood. Evidence of the latter can still be seen in traditional **middens** at Minnamurra River mouth.

Many elements of nature are represented in totems within the Aboriginal culture. The **Dreaming Poles** sculptures on the Kiama Coast Walk depict this important harmony with the land and sea. The **cabbage tree palms** seen throughout the region are one such totem that are also an important resource to the Wodi Wodi people. The versatile leaves of the palm were used to make shelter and mats, while strips of palm fibre made fishing line. The heart of the tree was reserved for special ceremonies.

New industries, new growth

It would not be until the turn of the 19th century that Europeans first set foot in these parts, and within decades the **ancient cedar forests** were cut and shipped out to help build a growing nation. **Quartz mining** would follow later in the 1800s, with Kiama a rich source of basalt in the building boom. Much of the region's iconic building projects took place during this time. These include **Kiama's harbour** (1876), **Post Office** (1878) and **Lighthouse** (1887) among others.

The 20th century brought the **railway** and **tourism** to Kiama. The advent of refrigeration also helped pioneer a thriving **dairy industry** across the lush green fields. Today, you can explore Kiama's history for yourself at the **Pilot's Cottage Museum** on Blowhole Point or at **Gerringong Library and Museum**.

Guirungutch, the Great Giant Eel

Many of our landmarks play an important role in the local Aboriginal history, culture and heritage of the Dharawal Nation. Important stories of the Wodi Wodi people have been passed down, including that of Gurrungutch, the Great Giant Eel — which tells of the creation of Cathedral Rocks and the Kiama blowholes. tip

) Did you know?

There are almost **400 dry stone walls** reminiscent of Britain and Ireland in the hills and fields around Kiama most built by Thomas Newing and his son between the 1860s and 1920s.

On the right track

If you meet a local who says "take a hike!" during your stay, don't be offended. They're actually encouraging you to enjoy our world-class walking tracks. From crashing waves to tumbling waterfalls, rainforests to rock formations, there's a path for everyone.

Kiama Coast Walk

6km-20km (1.5-6.5hrs) one way

This is the undisputed jewel in the crown — a coastal spine that stretches 20km from Minnamurra to Gerringong. Along the way, you'll discover many "wow" moments including dramatic clifftops, secret coves, unspoilt beaches and delightful detours. It's one of Australia's finest walks — complete the whole thing or one of the three smaller sections. For an indepth breakdown of Kiama Coast Walk, head to page 69.

Bombo Headland



This unique moonscape is the legacy of blue metal quarrying from more than a century ago, with surreal basalt columns and walls to explore.

Carrington Falls

600m (30mins)

In terms of bang-for-your-buck, this short walk guarantees maximum WOW for your steps! Enjoy the impressive falls lookout, waterholes and picnic spots.

Seven Mile Beach





Follow the waterline or sand track parallel to the coast just south of Gerroa, with dunes and forests of Blackbutt and Bangalay. (Also suitable for mountain bikes.)



Minnamurra Rainforest





Explore rare rainforest remnants and fauna in this lush escarpment setting, choosing the Falls Walk or shorter accessible Lyrebird Loop.

Barren Grounds





This plateau of walks is 'barren' in name only — with spectacular country and coastline views plus an abundance of birdlife and wildflowers when in season.

Hoddles Track (Saddleback Mountain) *Bkm* (3hrs) return

This challenging escarpment adventure is a must-do for bird watchers and nature lovers, as it follows the original goods route via Mt Noorinan. Head west past the furthest Saddleback Mtn vantage point, down the steep track.

Section 2 of the Kiama Coast Walk is largely on sealed paths, while the Lyrebird Loop Walk at Minnamurra Rainforest is also accessible-friendly.

Walking Tips

- Help protect our National Parks and reserves for future generations by staying on paths and respecting the environment at all times.
- Remember to carry water, your phone and sun protection.
- Weather conditions can change quickly always check the forecast before setting off and ensure you have appropriate clothing.
- » There is strictly no smoking in NSW National Parks.

- Xids and nature walks are a great combination, but can be dangerous, supervision is required.
- Take all rubbish with you or use bins if provided.
- After heavy rain, access to Gerringong from the Kiama Coast Walk may be limited. Call 1300 654 262 for Werri Lagoon access updates.

The side

Crikey! Kiama is like a coastal safari, boasting an abundance of wildlife across its diverse and colourful landscape. This happy habitat is the perfect playground for 'nature frothers' and casual observers alike.

Burri burri - humpback whales

From May to November, the migration (first north, then south with calves) of humpback whales (along with southern right and blue whales) can be seen easily from the shore. Some of the best vantage points can be found along the Kiama Coast Walk.

2 Norfolk Island pines

You'll find these iconic trees lining the coast — many planted back in the 1800s and known for their tolerance to the salt air. Fun fact: these tall straight trunks were once used for ships' masts.

These harbour dwellers are often seen gliding gracefully along our shore, or gathering at a boat ramp, wishfully hoping for a fisherman's snack. The Australian species has the biggest bill in the world — a bill that can hold more than its belly!

Dharawal - cabbage tree palms

The Wodi Wodi people introduced the sacred "Dharawal" to the region, spreading its seeds across the landscape. This iconic palm is the namesake of the area's traditional owners and holds deep cultural significance. Its leaves were also used to craft mats, fishing lines, and shelters.

Djawula - lyrebirds

This mountain bird is a totem of the Dharawal people and a symbol of peace. They are most famous for their mimicry skills — likely to be heard before they are seen, especially in the rainforests of the escarpment. Visit Minnamurra Rainforest for your best chance to witness their splendour.

6 Illawarra flame trees

Blooming bright red in spring, these trees are endemic to our area. Beyond their beauty, they served a practical purpose for centuries — their soft, spongy wood and bark were used to craft nets and fishing lines. In spring, look to TOP 10 natural encounters

the escarpment to see them dotted among the lush green landscape.

Moreton Bay figs

These beautifully distinctive, large trees feature intricate roots and a gnarly structure. You'll find giant examples at Black Beach Kiama, Hindmarsh Park and outside Kiama Library.

White bellied sea eagles

These pristinely white bellied beauties can often be seen along the Kiama Coast Walk hunting prey in the rocky outcrops. Listen out for their 'goose-like' honking sound!


In spring, the escarpment plateau becomes a carpet of wildflowers and butterflies — bursting with colour and life. Visit Carrington Falls or Barren Grounds for a colourful display.

10 Eastern ground parrots

Strikingly beautiful but shy, these lush green birds are a prized sight for bird-watchers — your best chance of spotting them is at Barren Grounds Nature Reserve.

For hundreds, if not thousands of years, people have flocked to the golden sands of Kiama. Today, our sparking coastline remains as inviting as ever.

After all, what's not to like? With nine distinct beaches to choose from (and a few more secret ones... shhhh), we're not just punching well above our weight — we deliver a knockout blow in the sheer number of sandy stretches, soothing saltwater and surf spots on offer.

Kiama's variety of surf breaks are suitable for everyone from beginners to the world's best. Meanwhile, safe swimming is provided throughout the warmer months, with patrolled beaches up and down the coast. (For exact dates and locations, see opposite page.) All beaches can be easily accessed on foot or by car — with many literally a few steps from holiday parks and other accommodation.

Even in the cooler months, a sunrise walk along our beaches is a magical thing — your footprints marking the sand while crashing waves provide a blissful backing track.

Whatever the season, our beaches are a must 'sea' attraction!

Crashing waves not your thing? Then the calm waters of **Minnamurra River** or **Crooked River** (Gerroa) are great. We also have the **ocean pools** in Kiama and Gerringong, **Kiama Leisure Centre** and an **outdoor pool** in Jamberoo. And you'll find natural swimming holes at **Nellies Glen** (Budderoo National Park), **Campbell's Hole** (Gerringong) and **Boneyard** (Bombo).

This experience is for all ages and stages, with breathtaking panoramic views across the region from this ancient rainforest. Want to get higher? Then get on board **Big Wave Skydive**, leaving from Shellharbour Airport and take in incredible coast views before landing at Bass Point Reserve.

Back on solid ground, Jamberoo's green hills are the setting for thrilling world-class rides at **Jamberoo Action Park** (September–April), NSW's largest family-owned water park. Or for splashes of a different kind, **Seven Mile Beach** is the ideal classroom for a surf lesson via **Surf Camp**, while farther out to sea you'll marvel at whales, dolphins and other marine life all aboard **Shellharbour Wild** ocean adventures.

If it's four-wheeled fun you crave, live out your top-gear fantasies by hiring a luxury car with **Prancing Horse Luxury Driving Experience** or **King of the Road** and meander through the scenic highways and byways. Or raise your pulse in a range of other leisure pursuits including scenic golf courses, tennis courts, skate parks, and more. 

And at nearby **Surf Beach**, enjoy beach wheelchairs during lifeguard hours and accessible bathroom.

Ready for a swim? Outdoors, the **Continental Pool** at Black Beach includes a ramp and nearby showers/ toilets, **Boat Harbour Pool** (Gerringong) includes accessible paths and a picnic area, while **Jamberoo Action Park** has accessible rides and dedicated amenities. If you're exploring in Jamberoo, there are MLAK key amenities at Kevin Walsh Oval. **Kiama Leisure Centre** is a great indoor option all year round, with a purpose-built pool hoist available at all times – just ask the friendly staff!

Families will love the newly updated (2024) **Hindmarsh Park playground** in Kiama — designed specifically with inclusivity and accessibility in mind and caters to physical and sensory needs, while the park's inviting shady picnic and free BBQ facilities make it an excellent stop.



The beauty of the Kiama region is that it's pocket-sized enough to explore all corners of it during your stay. All you need are some wheels (two or four) and a desire to discover what's around the next corner...

Four wheels

Who doesn't love a road trip? And once you tour our country lanes, coastal streets and stunning forested ways, you'll understand why Kiama regularly stars in so many car advertisements. Your assignment is simple: Keep your hands on the wheel, your eyes on the road and be prepared to stop regularly for village browsing, tasty bites and plenty of scenic photo opportunities!

One highlight is Tourist Drive 9 – follow the brown signs west from Kiama through **Jamberoo** and up through rainforests to attractions including **Illawarra Fly Treetop Adventure, Carrington Falls** and **Nellies Glen**. If you loop through Robertson and back via Kangaroo Valley and Berry, allow 3-4 hours for the round trip. A shorter loop takes you up **Saddleback Mountain** to the lookout at the very top (great views!), then back via Fountaindale Road through the rolling hills of **Jamberoo Valley**. Allow an hour for this one. And while you're out and about, include a cruise down Tasman Drive in Gerringong – voted Australia's most scenic street in 2024!

Take charge

If you're touring with an EV, you'll find public charging stations at Kiama Village, The Pavilion Kiama and Gerringong Bowlo, with a growing number of other charging points at local accommodation too.

The wheels

During the World Road Cycling champs in Wollongong a few years back, many of the international teams could be spotted regularly training in the challenging and uncluttered back roads across the Kiama region. They had discovered what we already knew — that this is a rewarding place for biking — from families and beginners to lycra-clad enthusiasts!

The dedicated cycle path from **Kiama Downs** to **Jamberoo** is a popular inland scenic ride, while coastal views abound on the path from **Minnamurra River** to **Kiama** via attractions including **Cathedral Rocks**, **Boneyard, Bombo Headland** and the **blowholes** — with natural stops and lookouts along the way. And families will love exploring the shared paths around Kiama's harbour and beaches or along **Gerringong's Werri Beach**. For something a little more challenging, **Seven Mile Beach** provides off road trails. **Minnamurra Bike Skills Track** includes a dedicated pump track, and the lanes and hills of **Jamberoo Valley and Mountain** are a technical road cyclist's dream!
